Initially thought to be designated F-19, this 'stealth' aeroplane was revealed in 1989 as the F-117, an angular and firmly subsonic type apparently designed for the subsonic strike role against heavily defended targets. The layout and structure of the aeroplane are designed to absorb, refract or attenuate the enemy's radar emissions, while the carefully shielded engines produce minimum heat for detection by infrared systems, allowing the aeroplane to penetrate enemy airspace undetected for the delivery of a single precision-guided weapon.
